Changes

- Colleges are encouraged to have their own meetings between advisory rand the executive committee member
- 3-year terms. All terms will start new in the fall
- Membership is limited to full time faculty

- Auburn UniversityUniversity Level
- "The general education outcomes are introduced to students in the Core Curriculum courses and reinforced throughout the courses students take as their major. link
- Assessment: Auburn "measures the Core Curriculum Student Learning Ou through an infrastructure known as the SCORE (Student Core Outcomes a Readiness Evaluation)...students are expected to take ar assessment during their last semester at Auburn, prior to graduating"
- Students will be randomly assigned one test aligned with a General Educat Student Learning Outcome based on the last digit of the ID link

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
